#### **NPC NEWS**

<u>POTATO LEADERSHIP INSTITUTE</u>- CPAC will be represented by Jared Smith and Lyla Davis. The class will be Feb. 8-16<sup>th</sup> and will start in Bangor, Maine and finish in Washington D.C.

<u>2017 NPC POTATO FLY-IN</u> - The Fly-in will be February 13-16 in Washington, D.C. Potato growers and industry leaders will listen and learn as featured political and policy arena speakers address key issues facing the potato industry. Attendees also meet with administration officials from agencies including the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the Environmental Protection Agency. The Fly-In culminates with attendees taking to Capitol Hill to lead the industry's grassroots advocacy efforts. The CPAC committee will assist a limited number of growers with registration and lodging cost for the Fly-in. Please contact the CPAC office if you are interested.

<u>NPC INSIDER REPORT</u> - There are five names leading the list for U.S. Secretary of Agriculture should Hillary Clinton win the election. That list includes Colorado's own governor John Hickelooper; Blanche Lincoln, a former Arkansas senator and first woman to serve as Chair of Senate Ag Committee; Kathleen Merrigan, the former deputy secretary of agriculture; Karen Ross, the current agriculture secretary of California; and Steve Beshear, the former governor of Kentucky. Hickenlooper has come out in support of the Trans-Pacific Partnership. Merrigan has been a leader in supporting local and small farmers. However, the leading candidate according to *Politico* is Ross, who was chief of staff for Agriculture Secretary Tom Vilsack and was president of the California Association of Winegrape Growers before assuming her current position in California.

### **RESEARCH COMMITTEE**

I am excited to share that Doug Messick has been selected to represent CPAC on the NPC Time Zone committee. This means Doug will be involved in reviewing potato research projects submitted to the Agricultural Research Service (ARS), and a member of the newly formed Potato Research Advisory Committee created in the re-organization of the Alliance for Potato Research and Education (APRE). This committee will work with state organizations and university researchers to develop a coordinated research strategy for the potato industry on the highest priority production issues affecting potato growers.

The agenda for the Southern Colorado Rocky Mountain Ag Conference is being finalized. The research sub-committee met with CSU Extension director Marvin Reynolds to provide input into the agenda at the CSU open house on October 13<sup>th</sup>.
