## NPC FLY-IN

CPAC was well represented at the NPC Fly-in from February 13-16th with thirteen participants, including our Potato Leadership Institute nominees Jared Smith and Lyla Davis. The group visited all nine Colorado congressional offices focusing primarily on funding for potato breeding and agricultural research, regulatory reform including tax reform, insuring the Environmental Protection Agency uses consistent and science based processes in their decision making, the importance of international trade to the potato industry, in particular trade with Canada and Mexico, and emphasized the need for federal funding to improve infrastructure, in particular water storage and transportation. This is a great opportunity for growers to experience the legislative process in Washington D.C. and take the message to congress.
