# 2021 NPC VIRTUAL POTATO FLY-IN



Due to D.C. government, congressional, and federal agency restrictions regarding COVID, the National Potato Council is moving the 2021 Potato D.C. Fly-In to a virtual event. The meeting will occur the week of Feb. 22-26 as originally scheduled and will also include the NPC Annual Meeting as previously announced. Registration will open in early 2021. ### **CDA NEWS**

The Colorado Department of Agriculture (CDA) Fruit and Vegetable Section still has cost-share funding to assist Colorado fruit and vegetable producers with the cost of USDA Good Agricultural Practices (GAP) and Good Handling Practices (GHP) audits. Farmers who are new to the audit program can be reimbursed for half the cost of the entire audit, up to \$500 per audit. Farmers who are renewing their audits are eligible for reimbursement of one-half of the new USDA administrative fee. The application is available at www.coloradoagriculture.com or producers can request one by calling (719) 852-4749 or emailing brian.pauley@state.co.us. This form must be submitted to the Fruit and Vegetable Section office, with a copy of the audit certificate, the invoice(s) showing the cost of the audit, proof of payment, and a completed W-9. Audits eligible for reimbursement include: Basic GAP/GHP, Produce GAP Harmonized, and Harmonized GAP Plus+. This cost-share program is made possible by a Specialty Crops Block Grant from USDA, obtained by the Colorado Department of Agriculture. The Agricultural Workforce Development Program provides financial incentives to farms, ranches, and agricultural businesses to hire interns and provide them with hands-on training needed to begin a career in agriculture. Qualified businesses may be reimbursed for up to 50 percent of the actual cost of hiring an intern, not to exceed \$5,000 per internship. Applications are now being accepted for 2021 AWDP internships. For priority consideration, businesses should complete the Business Application during the open application period, November 4 – December 18, 2020. Businesses that have already identified an intern are encouraged to have the selected intern complete the intern application as soon as possible to expedite the process. Applicants will be notified whether or not their internships will be awarded no later than February 16, 2021, and internships may begin as early as March 1, 2021. Rocky Mountain Russet (CO05068-1RU) is a medium to late Russet cultivar, and a heavy nitrogen feeder. A two years study conducted indicated that a total of 223 lbs per acre of available nitrogen (N) (soil residual N + irrigation water N + applied N) was needed to produce maximum tuber yield and quality.
